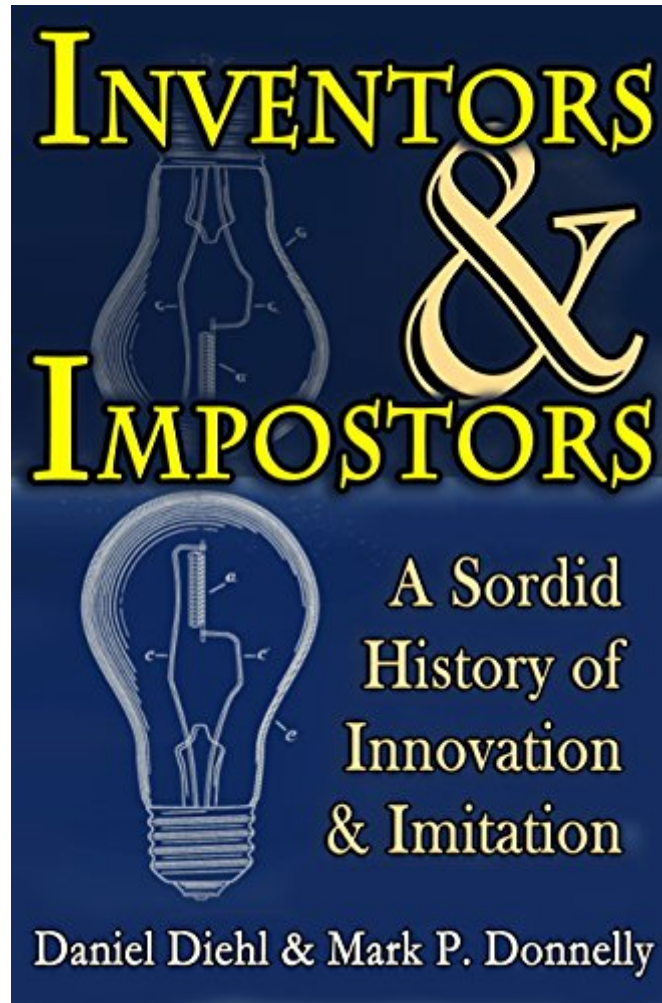


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Inventors & Impostors: A Sordid History Of Innovation And Imitation
